5 MAYOR JAMES T. BUTTS, JR.: Okay, Madam
6 Clerk, could you call the roll?

7 CITY CLERK YVONNE HORTON: Successor
8 Agency, Housing Authority and Parking Authority.

9 MAYOR JAMES T. BUTTS, JR.: All right
10 before we start with the agenda, are there any
11 persons present that wish to address the City
12 Council on any item on today's agenda? Now I
13 can't see downstairs; we're supposed to be able
14 to see them. There we go, okay. Seeing --
15 hearing no comment, we'll close public comment,
16 and we'll move to -- let's see. To item -- to
17 item A-2. Madam Clerk, could you call it?

18 CITY CLERK YVONNE HORTON: Inglewood
19 Residents Against Taking and Eviction,
20 (indiscernible) LLC, and other entities and
21 individuals in furtherance of the potential
22 settlement of claims arising from the proposed
23 development of, and CEQA review for the Inglewood
24 Basketball and Entertainment Center projects, as
25 well as obligations of land owner of the Forum.

1 CONCIL MEMBER RALPH FRANKLIN: Move one
2 and two.

3 CITY ATTORNEY KENNETH R. CAMPOS:
4 Second.

5 MAYOR JAMES T. BUTTS, JR.: Madam
6 Clerk.

7 CITY CLERK YVONNE HORTON: Council
8 Members Padilla?

9 COUNCIL MEMBER ALEX PADILLA: Aye.

10 CITY CLERK YVONNE HORTON: Morales?

11 COUNCIL MEMBER ELOY MORALES, JR.: Aye

12 CITY CLERK YVONNE HORTON: Franklin?

13 COUNCIL MEMBER RALPH FRANKLIN: Aye.

14 CITY CLERK YVONNE HORTON: Mayor Butts?

15 MAYOR JAMES T. BUTTS, JR.: Aye. And

5 MAYOR JAMES T. BUTTS, JR.: DR-1, CSA-

7 COUNCIL MEMBER ELOY MORALES, JR.:
8 Departmental report right after --

9 MAYOR JAMES T. BUTTS, JR.:
10 Departmental report on Page 6.

11 CITY CLERK YVONNE HORTON: Staff report
12 recommending approval of Amendment Number 1 to
13 Agreement Number 20-020 with Kane, Ballmer &
14 Berkman to provide legal services on behalf of
15 the City, Successor Agency, Housing Authority and
16 Parking Authority.

17 COUNCIL MEMBER ELOY MORALES, JR.: As
18 to City Council, move Item 1 and as to the City
19 Council, Successor Agency, Housing Authority, and
20 Parking authority move Item 1.

21 COUNCIL MEMBER ALEX PADILLA: Second.

22 MAYOR JAMES T. BUTTS, JR.: Madam
23 Clerk?

24 CITY CLERK YVONNE HORTON: City
25 Council, Successor Agency, Housing Authority, and

1 Parking Authority Members. Padilla?

2 COUNCIL MEMBER ALEX PADILLA: Aye.

3 CITY CLERK YVONNE HORTON: Morales?

4 COUNCIL MEMBER ELOY MORALES, JR.: Aye.

5 CITY CLERK YVONNE HORTON: Franklin?

6 COUNCIL MEMBER RALPH FRANKLIN: Aye.

7 CITY CLERK YVONNE HORTON: Mayor

8 Chairman Butts?

9 MAYOR JAMES T. BUTTS, JR.: Aye. Item
10 Cs-1, CS-5 and P-2. Oh, excuse me, I'm sorry, we
11 already took care of those. I withdraw --

12 CITY CLERK YVONNE HORTON: No?

13 MAYOR JAMES T. BUTTS, JR.: I withdraw
14 that, I withdraw that. I'm on the wrong page.
15 Let's go to DR-1, CSA-1 and H-1. Say it again
16 now?

17 CITY CLERK YVONNE HORTON: We need to
18 take the vote for the City Council.

19 MAYOR JAMES T. BUTTS, JR.: Oh, okay,
20 Madam Clerk.

21 CITY CLERK YVONNE HORTON: So that is
22 for DR-1 CSA-4, H-4 and P-1. And calling the
23 vote for the City Council. I have a motion.

24 COUNCIL MEMBER ELOY MORALES, JR.: I
25 made both motions.

1 COUNCIL MEMBER RALPH FRANKLIN: We
2 already did that.

3 CITY CLERK YVONNE HORTON: Yes, but we
4 have to do --

5 COUNCIL MEMBER RALPH FRANKLIN:
6 Separately.

7 COUNCIL MEMBER ELOY MORALES, JR.: So
8 moved, C-1.

9 COUNCIL MEMBER ALEX PADILLA: Second.

10 MAYOR JAMES T. BUTTS, JR.: You're the
11 boss. First and second; first by Morales, second
12 by Franklin.

13 CITY CLERK YVONNE HORTON: Council
14 members. Padilla?

15 COUNCIL MEMBER ALEX PADILLA: Aye.

16 CITY CLERK YVONNE HORTON: Morales?

17 COUNCIL MEMBER ELOY MORALES, JR.: Aye.

18 CITY CLERK YVONNE HORTON: Franklin?

21 MAYOR JAMES T. BUTTS, JR.: Aye. All

2 MAYOR JAMES T. BUTTS, JR.: Madam
3 clerk?

4 CITY CLERK YVONNE HORTON: Council,
5 Successor Agency and Housing Authority Members.
6 Padilla?

7 COUNCIL MEMBER ALEX PADILLA: Aye.

8 CITY CLERK YVONNE HORTON: Morales?

9 COUNCIL MEMBER ELOY MORALES, JR.: Aye.

10 CITY CLERK YVONNE HORTON: Franklin?

11 COUNCIL MEMBER RALPH FRANKLIN: Aye.

12 CITY CLERK YVONNE HORTON: Mayor

13 Chairman Butts?

14 MAYOR JAMES T. BUTTS, JR.: Aye.

15 Consent Calendar Items 2 through 11.

16 COUNCIL MEMBER ELOY MORALES, JR.: So
17 moved.

18 COUNCIL MEMBER ALEX PADILLA: Second.

19 MAYOR JAMES T. BUTTS, JR.: Madam
20 Clerk.

21 CITY CLERK YVONNE HORTON: Council
22 member Padilla.

23 COUNCIL MEMBER ALEX PADILLA: Aye.

24 CITY CLERK YVONNE HORTON: Morales?

25 COUNCIL MEMBER ELOY MORALES, JR.: Aye.

1 CITY CLERK YVONNE HORTON: Franklin?

2 COUNCIL MEMBER RALPH FRANKLIN: Aye.

3 CITY CLERK YVONNE HORTON: Mayor?

4 MAYOR JAMES T. BUTTS, JR.: Aye. CI-1.

5 CITY CLERK YVONNE HORTON: Initiative

6 by Mayor James T Butts, Jr. recommending the
7 adoption of an Executive Order Number 20-01 to
8 declare the following: number one, the local
9 emergency is extended --

10 MAYOR JAMES T. BUTTS, JR.: To the
11 maximum extent.

12 CITY CLERK YVONNE HORTON: Oh, sorry
13 about that. Maximum extent authorized by the
14 state law and any -- and any order promulgated by
15 the Mayor (indiscernible) provide for the
16 protection of life and property pursuant to the
17 Government Code Section (indiscernible) by the
18 City Council at the earliest practicable time.

19 (indiscernible) no landlord shall evict
20 a resident (indiscernible) local emergency whose
21 financial hardship is directly linked to the
22 COVID-19 pandemic. (indiscernible) the passage
23 of this executive order does not relieve a tenant
24 of its obligations to pay rent nor restricts the
25 landlord's ability to recover rent due.

1 (indiscernible) tenants have six months from the
2 termination of the local emergency by the city or
3 termination by the state emergency to pay back
4 the rent owed.

5 COUNCIL MEMBER ELOY MORALES, JR.: So
6 moved, but, Mayor, do you want to have a
7 discussion?

8 MAYOR JAMES T. BUTTS, JR.: There will
9 definitely be discussion.

10 COUNCIL MEMBER RALPH FRANKLIN: And I
11 second.

12 MAYOR JAMES T. BUTTS, JR.: Okay, the
13 first and second. Okay, a couple things. First,
14 under number three, we need to change spelling of
15 who's to W-H-O-S-E as opposed to the possessive
16 pronoun. And then secondly in addition to this
17 it is my belief -- this is -- this is meant to
18 protect, to extend the protections from an
19 eviction to commercial tenants as well as
20 residential tenants.

21 It also has come to my attention and
22 other council members' attention that there are
23 other impacts on the residents as it relates to
24 this emergency that has been declared. And one
25 of the big ones is parking. I have asked for a

1 study of the generation of parking citations
2 related to street-sweeping. It appears that
3 there was confusion generated when the Mayor of
4 Los Angeles announced a moratorium on parking
5 street-sweeping citations in the city.

6 There's a difference in that city and
7 this city, because we do trash pickup on the same
8 day as street-sweeping and so we cannot just
9 abdicate the authority to make sure that trash
10 can be picked up. That being said, I believe
11 that we need to look and see how this has
12 impacted our residents, particularly those that
13 were confused, and make adjustments if we find it
14 to be necessary.

15 Further, there's the issue of trash
16 pickup for commercial businesses that have not
17 been allowed to be in operation and have not
18 generated trash. And there's an issue of
19 fundamental fairness as it relates to them being
20 charged by the City for trash pickup for a month
21 where they generated no trash, and that needs to
22 be explored in greater depth. Councilman Morales
23 had some ideas about what we could do to assist
24 in the parking situation.

25 COUNCIL MEMBER ELOY MORALES, JR.:

1 Thank you, Mayor. If I may?

2 MAYOR JAMES T. BUTTS, JR.: I'm going
3 to -- I'm going to give that to you -- over to
4 you as it relates to relieving the pressure on
5 residents that are at home all day. Councilman?

6 COUNCIL MEMBER ELOY MORALES, JR.:
7 Thank you, Mayor. And I'm open to any suggestion
8 you have on the relief that might exist for the
9 residents who were ticketed. Because I believe
10 you're right, I believe that there was confusion
11 as to who was allowed to park with no actual
12 tickets being given, and since it was so widely
13 announced in the media. So I think you're right
14 about the confusion.

15 In addition to that, you know, and the
16 Mayor mentioned, I mentioned as well, I think
17 it's extremely important that we continue to
18 allow our services being trash and street-
19 sweeping to take place. However, during that
20 time frame, and however much you wanted to
21 discuss expanding it, I was mentioning that we
22 should open up our city lots around the city
23 during that time, during the week, so that folks
24 that cannot find parking that are now at home can
25 park there at least to make it through the time

1 period that we have posted, so that our trash can
2 be picked up and our street-sweeping can be
3 picked up.

4 I know that I actually represented an
5 area that is exhausted in parking, and if we
6 don't do something that shows, you know, the fact
7 that we understand that now there's a variety of
8 people at home, we're just going to see this on a
9 weekly basis. So, Mayor, I'd like to enter that
10 into the discussion as well as a friendly
11 amendment.

12 MAYOR JAMES T. BUTTS, JR.: Well, yeah,
13 all this is a discussion, because what would have
14 to happen is we would have to come back, generate
15 a staff report to discuss these items, because
16 this has not been agendized. So this is just a
17 discussion at this point, and call for a special
18 meeting on Friday to explore this when it's been
19 noticed, and the public could have a chance to
20 weigh in.

21 COUNCIL MEMBER ELOY MORALES, JR.:
22 Okay.

23 MAYOR JAMES T. BUTTS, JR.: And then
24 then Councilman Franklin had one more anecdote.
25 These are only anecdote at this point.

1 COUNCIL MEMBER RALPH FRANKLIN: Yeah,
2 these -- yes, so first of all, Mayor and
3 Councilman Morales, thank you very much for
4 bringing up the parking issue. That has
5 escalated because of the understanding of what
6 was being imposed by the City of Los Angeles
7 versus us in maintaining the status of the
8 Inglewood Municipal for the City of Inglewood for
9 parking.

10 But there's been another issue that's
11 raised regarding the businesses that have dealt
12 with either closures or the businesses
13 substantially been hit hard by the COVID-19. And
14 I want to weigh in, for the billings that the
15 city provides, particularly whether utility
16 bills, being the water or sewer. There's been
17 new items that come up regarding alarm permits
18 and business license. So if we bring those up
19 for discussions for our next meeting, I'd
20 appreciate it.

21 MAYOR JAMES T. BUTTS, JR.: Okay, all
22 right. Okay with that, Madam Clerk?

23 COUNCIL MEMBER ELOY MORALES, JR.: Just
24 to clarify, Mayor?

25 MAYOR JAMES T. BUTTS, JR.: The move

1 adoption has been, motion been made by Councilman
2 Morales, and we don't have a second as yet.

3 COUNCIL MEMBER ALEX PADILLA: I second
4 it.

5 MAYOR JAMES T. BUTTS, JR.: Okay, and a
6 second, so we have a second. Madam Clerk?

7 CITY CLERK YVONNE HORTON: Council
8 Members. Padilla?

9 COUNCIL MEMBER ALEX PADILLA: Aye.

10 CITY CLERK YVONNE HORTON: Morales?

11 COUNCIL MEMBER ELOY MORALES, JR.: Aye

12 CITY CLERK YVONNE HORTON: Franklin?

13 COUNCIL MEMBER RALPH FRANKLIN: Aye.

14 CITY CLERK YVONNE HORTON: Mayor Butts?

15 MAYOR JAMES T. BUTTS, JR.: Aye. And
16 to clarify for people that are watching the
17 council meeting, the main thrust of this
18 amendment extends the eviction protections to
19 commercial tenants as well as residential
20 tenants.

21 COUNCIL MEMBER ELOY MORALES, JR.: And
22 also, Mayor, if I can clarify something?

23 MAYOR JAMES T. BUTTS, JR.: Yes.

24 COUNCIL MEMBER ELOY MORALES, JR.: You
25 mentioned that you were going to bring forward

1 some options to perhaps consider providing relief
2 to the folks who were misguided in terms --

3 MAYOR JAMES T. BUTTS, JR.: Oh,
4 absolutely.

5 COUNCIL MEMBER ELOY MORALES, JR.: And
6 you will be bringing it back at a special
7 meeting. And I say that just to clarify for
8 folks that might be watching with that issue.

9 MAYOR JAMES T. BUTTS, JR.: Right, that
10 was a discussion that will be brought back on an
11 agenda this Friday for a special meeting, all
12 those things.

13 COUNCIL MEMBER ELOY MORALES, JR.:
14 Thank you.

15 MAYOR JAMES T. BUTTS, JR.: All right?
16 Item A-1, CSA-7, and P-4.

17 CITY ATTORNEY KENNETH R. CAMPOS: I'm
18 sorry, Mayor. I have it as CS-1, CSA-5 and P-2
19 for the first item, which was a closed session
20 regarding litigation were between MSG and the
21 City of Inglewood. It was a joint meeting with
22 the City, the Successor Agency and the Parking
23 Authority as to that item. Discussion held,
24 direction given to staff.

25 The second item, Mayor, is CS-2, CSA-6

1 and P-03. Again, that was a joint meeting
2 between the City of Inglewood, the Successor
3 Agency and the Parking Authority. And that
4 matter was Inglewood Residents Against Taking and
5 Evictions v. City of Inglewood, et al. As to
6 that matter, it was a joint meeting between the
7 City Council, the Successor Agency, and the
8 Parking Authority, and in that matter, a
9 discussion was held, direction given to staff.

10 MAYOR JAMES T. BUTTS, JR.: Item --
11 adjourn the Parking Authority, Item A-2.

12 CITY ATTORNEY KENNETH R. CAMPOS:
13 Mayor, if that's the close --

14 MAYOR JAMES T. BUTTS, JR.: Oh, we sure
15 did.

16 CITY CLERK YVONNE HORTON: That was
17 first.

18 MAYOR JAMES T. BUTTS, JR.: I liked it
19 so much --

20 CITY CLERK YVONNE HORTON: Let's do it
21 again.

22 MAYOR JAMES T. BUTTS, JR.: Let's do it
23 again. A-3.

24 CITY ATTORNEY KENNETH R. CAMPOS:
25 Mayor, if that's the -- for the City Attorney's

1 Office, no comment regarding --

2 MAYOR JAMES T. BUTTS, JR.: CM-1.

3 CITY MANAGER ARTIE FIELDS: No comment
4 from the City Manager's office.

5 MAYOR JAMES T. BUTTS, JR.: CT-1.

6 CITY CLERK YVONNE HORTON: You skipped
7 me, CC-1.

8 MAYOR JAMES T. BUTTS, JR.: Oh, I did
9 say CC-1. I'm sorry, CC-1. Respect.

10 COUNCIL MEMBER ELOY MORALES, JR.: Is
11 the principle.

12 MAYOR JAMES T. BUTTS, JR.: CT-1.

13 CITY CLERK YVONNE HORTON: Monthly
14 Treasurer's Report for the month ending December
15 31, 2019.

16 MAYOR JAMES T. BUTTS, JR.: Received
17 and filed. CT-2, all reports of city treasurer.
18 Why don't you let her use your microphone? Oh,
19 okay. Okay.

20 CITY TREASURER WANDA BROWN: Thank you,
21 Mayor. Just like to give a monthly treasurer
22 report as of December 31st. And again, there's
23 copies on the tables for those to pick up.

24 For the City of Inglewood, funds under
25 management total cash and investment \$86,163,222.

1 The gross investment interest earnings to service
2 debt, \$3,022, and the gross investment interest
3 earnings is \$98,733. Successor Agency funds
4 under management, \$47,305,299. Gross investments
5 earning to service debt \$19,274. Housing
6 Authority, \$106,952. Joint Powers Authority,
7 \$9,109,713, and the interest to service debt,
8 \$3,425. Total funds under management to service
9 debt is \$142,685,186.

10 And I'd like also to -- I didn't get a
11 chance to give my, this report last week. I want
12 to just continue on with special thank you to
13 Yakima (indiscernible), and her partner, Ms.
14 Lowe, who provided me with some good information
15 for a resident who called me regarding their
16 being evicted after living in their single-family
17 residence for 22 years. And I was informed that
18 there's no remedy for condos and single-family
19 residence. So thank you for giving her
20 direction, Yakima and Ms. Lowe.

21 And also, I want to acknowledge some
22 outstanding other -- other law enforcement
23 officers and also Cindy (indiscernible). Some
24 years ago I served as senior community -- as
25 former volunteer coordinator under Chief

1 (indiscernible). And I had a little office there
2 in his department, and a matter of fact, former
3 Sergeant (indiscernible) Butts and Diane Robinson
4 were my supervisors. I used to ride around in
5 the police car with the officers, so I really
6 enjoyed that. That was before I was treasurer.
7 So I've actually served under five police chiefs,
8 and three city administrators, and three city
9 managers, and multiple active city managers, and
10 ten former council members.

11 And I'd like to acknowledge these
12 officers, and I've already sent these
13 notifications to the Chief Mark. Officer
14 Espinoza, Badge Number 893, Officer Kiefer, K-I-
15 E-F-E-R, Badge Number 887. Officer N. Mann,
16 1026, Officer M. Rodriguez, Badge Number 7198, or
17 7298, and Officer Viteca, V-I-T-E-C-A, Badge
18 Number 1053, and Officer (indiscernible), Badge
19 Number 1007. They've just been providing just
20 some exceptional service to the -- to the
21 community, you know, going around and monitoring
22 homes and offering help to residents. So these
23 are some of our many, many outstanding officers.

24 And Cindy (indiscernible) has just done
25 a remarkable job, you know, with the homeless.

1 There was a young man that was on the corner of
2 Century and Prairie. I often stopped to help
3 him. He would never accept any clothing, but he
4 would accept the money. But she went one step
5 further. She picked that guy up and took him out
6 to the Veterans Affairs, and got him his
7 benefits, and now he's a productive citizen. So
8 I certainly want to thank her, you know, for her,
9 for her wonderful service.

10 And again, the free income tax service
11 program had to be canceled due to the
12 coronavirus. Both of my people in my office have
13 gotten sick with the flu, and it been sick over
14 the past seven months. But I finished all of the
15 returns and the last batch can be picked up this
16 Friday by appointments. So everyone has already
17 made their appointments. So that concludes my
18 comments and my report.

19 MAYOR JAMES T. BUTTS, JR.: Thank you.
20 Any person who wishes to address the City Council
21 in any matter connect --
