

Together, we are facing a truly unprecedented challenging situation. The global coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic is affecting all our families, our business, and our way of life. However, we remain committed to developing programs that will protect the quality of life for our residents. As many of you are aware, the new home of the NFL's Los Angeles Rams and Los Angeles Chargers, SoFi Stadium, is set to open this summer without or limited reduced number of fans. SoFi Stadium will host sports and live entertainment year-round and has already secured WrestleMania 37 in 2021, Super Bowl LVI in 2022, the College Football National Championship Game in 2023, and the Opening and Closing Ceremonies of the Olympic Games in 2028.

We are working diligently to develop traffic control management strategies and policy regulations to protect Inglewood residents from parking and traffic matters associated with these events. In anticipation of SoFi Stadium's opening day and future developments, the City of Inglewood is updating its existing Permit Parking Program to give local residents priority for on-street parking in residential areas.

Residents will have the ability to apply for permit parking passes online at the Parking & Enterprise Services Department webpage on the City of Inglewood's website. Why a Citywide Permit Parking Program?

- Preserve and protect quality of life
- Alleviate traffic increasing in neighborhoods
- Minimize non-residential parking intrusion

- Eliminates the need for residents to compete for on-street parking



How will the program work?

	Note: Permits will be tied to vehicle license plate. Vehicle registration address must match the resident's address.	
Costs & Fees	Two permit parking passes per residential address are FREE	
Enforcement	Parking for up to 2-hours will be allowed for vehicles without permits. However, after two hours, the vehicle will be subject to a strict ticket and tow policy.
