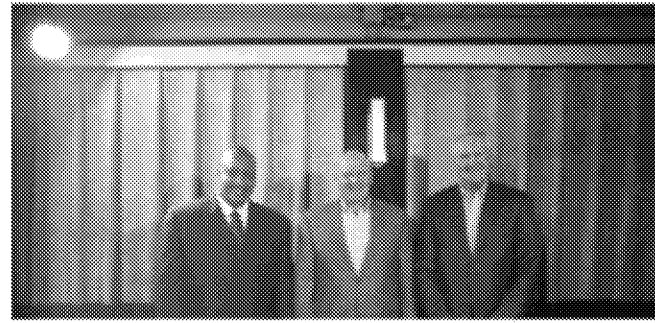

## Clippers Arena in Inglewood Cleared to Go

The construction of the project will include a world-class basketball arena, practice facility and team offices for the L.A. Clippers.

The Los Angeles Clippers announced today that the city of Inglewood has approved the construction of a new arena and practice facility. The project, which will cost approximately \$1.2 billion, is set to begin construction in early 2017 and is expected to be completed by 2019.
